The Butterflies are Coming!

Learn about the Butterfly Life Cycle

- Painted Lady Butterfly: Egg, Larva (caterpillar), Pupa (chrysalis), Adult
- Learn how to care for a chrysalis and what to do when the adult butterfly emerges

Butterfly kits must be picked up at the Library

Each child (one per family) will receive a live chrysalis (or butterfly, if they have hatched) kit containing a *Painted Lady* butterfly.

****We are entrusting a live specimen to your child****

Please be sure your child is mature enough to respect insect life, and that you can participate in the program with your child.
